
NOVEMBER MONTHLY MEETING EVENT

Our guest speaker this month was Nick Bankston. formerly served as the Director of Community Affairs in the Office of the Mayor for the City of Columbus. Born and raised in Columbus, Ohio, Nick is a proud graduate of East High School and holds a Bachelor's degree in Philosophy from The Ohio State University. As a leader under Mayor Ginther's administration, Nick has been working to promote neighborhood revitalization in



the Linden Community. To see some of the projects he has been a part of please visit: www.ourlinden.com. His office is now surveying the Hilltop neighborhood to learn what issues need addressed.

Nick started out with the goal in mind of community outreach and engagement. He served on former Columbus Mayor Michael B. Coleman's election campaign in 2007, then as a member of his administration in 2010-2012. Our current City Council President Shannon G. Hardin, was Nick's mentor. In 2015, former Mayor Coleman reached out to Nick and asked him to work on Mayor



Ginther's campaign. In 2016, the Department of Neighborhoods was created to consolidate services provided by Neighborhood Pride, the Community Relations Commission, neighborhood liaisons and the 311 customer service center into one department which looks into long term strategic planning in order to reinvest in neighborhoods.

Robert K. Greenleaf introduced the term "servant-leadership" nearly fifty years ago. The Servant Leadership Institute cites: more engagement and accountability; added confidence and dedication; decreased sick days; increased employee retention; and maximized profits as benefits of this leadership approach. In this webinar, we will explore what it means to be a true servant leader. Webinars are usually conducted on the third Thursday of the month except for January and July.

A webinar was held on Thursday, November 15, 2018 at 12 pm and 3 pm Titled "At Your Service: Leader as Servant First" with Facilitator Wanda King, President of The Center for Professional Training and Development in Columbia, MD.



She covered the following topics:

- 1. Listening- gives complete focus/attention; making eye contact; truly hearing speaker rather than just giving a response; stop trying to multi-task
- 2. Empathy-having compassion/understanding for others
- 3. Healing-recognizing/acknowledging any issues/feelings from others; validates feelings; adversarial relationships turn into friendly relationships
- 4. Awareness-ability to read others
- 5. Persuasion-communicating common goals; win/win situation; telling people WIIFM; this person is also a good communicator
- 6. Conceptualization- focused on the bigger picture
- 7. Foresight- asking what could happen, and making decisions based on history; this person has an intuitive mind
- 8. Stewardship-holding a commitment to serve others
- 9. Commitment to the Growth of People-nurturing personal/professional training/growth; encouraging decision making
- 10. Building Community
