



Local 4502 Human Rights Committee Seeking Holiday Help

CWA Local 4502 Human Rights Committee is offering a way to get into the Holiday Spirit by supporting The Miracle on Long Street. This organization supports those in need in the immediate neighborhood of our union hall. The Miracle on Long Street event will be held Saturday, December 1st, between 2:30 pm and 6:30 pm at St. Dominic Roman Catholic Church, 453 N. 20th Street, Columbus, 43203, in the Parish Center at the rear of the church (parking lot entrance on south side of church). There are two ways to volunteer with our Human Rights Committee:

JACKSON PIKE JOURNAL

August 2018

- Safety/Security Update:
- We have now surpassed 340 days worked without a lost time injury. Please stay safe and be sure to communicate any safety issues with your Supervisor.
- August 10th and 11th rain events dumped over 3" or rain in western parts of the City testing the updated Operational parameters of OSIS Regulator Gates, SMR and OARS. Even with raw sewage pumping problems at both Jackson Pike and Southerly, quick communication between both plants allowed operations to ease through these events with no bypasses and fairly normal Operations. During the 8/11 event, a calculated new flow rate of 1.9 billion gallons per day instantaneous flow was recorded entering OARS, which is a new record since start up. Some damage was found at Manhole #10 at OARS dropshaft 4 which was potentially caused by air pressure surge during this event. Engineering is evaluating this event to determine future resolutions.
- The Operations Challenge team competed at the 2018 One Water Conference in Columbus and brought home the Gold by winning 1st Place. They will now travel to New Orleans to represent Cbus at the National WEFTEC Conference in October. Their hard work is paying off.
